





Vocabulary

<b>canines</b>	pointed teeth between the incisors and premolars used for tearing food.
<b>carnivore</b>	an animal that feeds on other animals
<b>consumer</b>	a living thing that must eat other living things to gain energy
<b>digestion</b>	the process where food is broken down so it can be used by the body
<b>food chain</b>	An order of living things which shows how energy is passed from one living thing to another
<b>herbivore</b>	an animal that eats plants
<b>incisors</b>	the narrow-edged teeth at the front of the mouth which cut food
<b>large intestine</b>	part of the intestine where water is absorbed from remaining food waste. Stools are formed in the large intestine.
<b>molars</b>	teeth at the back of the mouth used for grinding food.
<b>oesophagus</b>	a muscular tube which moves food from the mouth to the stomach
<b>omnivore</b>	an animal that eats plants and animals
<b>predator</b>	an animal that hunts and eats other animals
<b>premolars</b>	teeth between the incisors and molars which are used for crushing food
<b>prey</b>	an animal that gets hunted and eaten by other animals
<b>producer</b>	a plant that produces its own food
<b>rectum</b>	part of the digestive system where stools are stored before leaving the body through the anus
<b>small intestine</b>	part of the intestine where nutrients are absorbed into the body
<b>stomach</b>	an organ in the digestive system where food is broken down with stomach acid and by being churned around
<b>omnivore</b>	an animal that eats plants and animals



Human Teeth and Their Functions




Some people have wisdom teeth but they have no function now.
